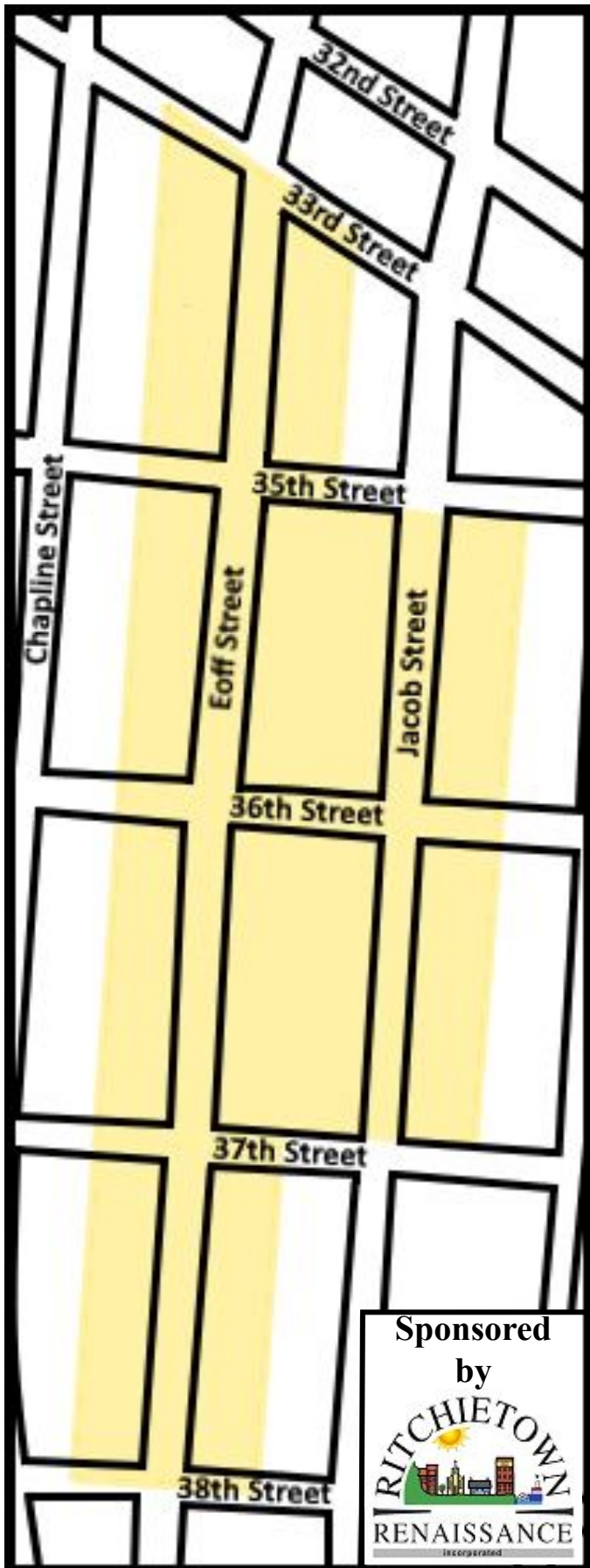

Oriel Window

A form of bay window which protrudes from the main wall of a building and does not reach to the ground



Dentil Molding

A type of carved trim that consists of a series of small, rectangular blocks that together appear teeth-like



Italianate/Bracketed Cornice

An ornamental molding that involves the addition of the longer bracket pieces which support the roofline



Chimney Pot

A pipe placed atop a chimney to increase the draft; often used as a decorative element



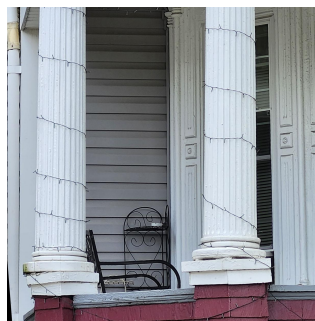
Decorative Wood Window Hood

A decorative piece placed above window openings and provides some protection from the elements for the window



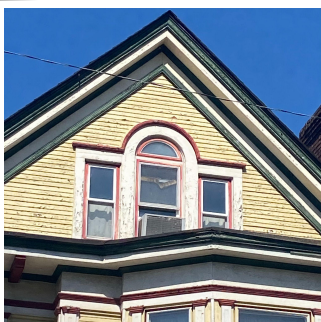
Painted Building Advertising

Painting signs directly onto buildings was a popular form of advertising for many years prior to television and mass media



Fluted Column

Column with shallow grooves carved into the shaft that run vertically, most associated with Greek-style architecture



Palladian Window

Three part window with a central arched section with flanked by smaller rectangular sections



Brick Corbels

A ledge formed by layers of brick projecting out from the face of the wall



Soldier Course

Brickwork style that involves laying bricks on end, with the narrowest edge facing outward, used for decorative effect
